#### **STOP PRESS - take positive** action for a marine park in Australia

We welcome WA Environment Minister Bill Marmion's announcement about sanctuary zones along Australia's northwest coast between Port Hedland and Broome to provide higher levels of protection for marine biodiversity (> read more). Our WA turtle conservation project at Eco Beach, and therefore within the area mentioned by Bill Marmion, has been arguing for this for some time. We are delighted that it has now gone into the public consultation phase. You can support our efforts by writing to Bill Marmion at

.wa.gov.au arguing that a marine park is essential to protect biodiversity in the face of increasing oil, gas & mineral exploitation in the state and seeing that less than 1% of Kimberley marine areas are currently protected.
